

Vasse Taskforce

August 2023 | Meeting 28

The twenty-eighth Vasse Taskforce meeting was held in Busselton on 25 August 2023 Chaired by Hon. Pierre Yang (MLC).

1. Revitalising Geographe Waterways Investment Plan

The Taskforce members reviewed and endorsed the Revitalising Geographe Waterways Investment Plan for 2025-2029. The plan is based evaluations of the RGW program to date and input from Taskforce partners. The investment plan outlines key priorities and associated state government and Taskforce partner funding to 2027.

2. Lower Vasse River Sediment Removal

Taskforce members were given an update of the sediment removal project in the Lower Vasse River. Stage 2 dredging is now complete and dewatering in geotextile bags will continue until November/December. Planning for stage 3 is underway and proposed for April/May 2024.

3. Phoslock application in the Lower Vasse River

A phoslock application has been scheduled for some sections of the Lower Vasse River during October to December. Timing will depend on rainfall and flow as well as phosphorus concentrations in the water. An update of the project will be provided at the City of Busselton's community update in November.

4. Community Update '10 Years On'

GeoCatch reported to the Taskforce on the '10 Years On' Community Update held in April to mark ten years since the large fish kill in the Vasse Estuary. Presenters from DWER and Murdoch University spoke about events leading up to the fish kill, past and current management, and improvements in collaboration and science over the last ten years. The event was well attended and received by the community, with 86% of attendees believing management of the wetlands had improved significantly since the 2013 fish kill event, and 96% having a high confidence in the science underpinning management decisions.
